# **Building Communities**



The heart of FFA is the local chapter. Kentucky FFA has more than 165 FFA chapters deeply ingrained in communities across our Commonwealth. When a donor chooses to support local FFA Chapter development, the impact is far-reaching.

#### Gifts to our Building Communities Fund accomplish the following:

#### Grants for FFA Chapters to provide classroom materials that further agricultural instruction.

Grants include investments in an aquaculture processing lab at LaRue County High School, a student land lab at Thomas Nelson, and so many other upgrades to technology, construction, equipment & more.

#### Fund community service projects and opportunities for FFA chapters.

This includes our Better Days Better Ways Grant program, which gives \$1,000 to chapters to start a sustainable food production project that benefits a food bank in their community.



# Support agriculture teacher professional development and coaching.

Kentucky's support of agricultural teachers is one-of-akind. This includes our Kentucky Master Ag Teacher Program to develop and encourage veteran teachers to lead their profession, the Teacher Mentoring Program for first year teachers, and even a Program Development Specialist, a veteran teacher consultant who visits with teachers at their schools to help address issues or opportunities specific to their own situations.

# **Strengthening Agriculture**



The future of the agriculture industry is dependent on the next generation to be better food, fiber and fuel producers than ever before. Kentucky FFA members earned \$19.2 million through their Supervised Agricultural Experience Projects in 2018. They are not only the future of the industry, they *ARE* part of the industry now.

#### Support for our Strengthening Agriculture Projects include:

Grants for students to develop Supervised Agricultural Experience Projects, like when Olivia Moore was awarded \$5,000 to invest in her produce delivery box business, "Moore Goodness."

#### Record keeping and business planning software for students to become better managers and entrepreneurs.

This software is web based and there's an app on students' phones, giving our members a head-start in entrepreneurship. This app allowed them to earn \$19.2 million in 2018! Awards for students SAE Projects, including proficiency finalists
