

# Talent

## Event Rules

All members participating in this Career Development Event must meet the eligibility requirements and adhere to the rules of the Kentucky FFA Association as outlined in the Rules Governing FFA Activities document.

A chapter's talent act may consist of one or more members. All members of the group must be FFA members.

Official Dress Appropriate: Yes

Regional Event: Regional FFA Day (or other location determined by the region)

State Event: State FFA Convention

No more than five (5) minutes may be used by a group in the event.

If an accompanist other than a member of the chapter is used, the group will furnish its own accompanist, but the work of such accompanist will not be considered in the judging.

All members are to be in official dress unless it is not appropriate for the act.

A score sheet is provided for musical talent acts. Non-musical talent acts will be scored at the discretion of the judges.

Regional winning talent acts will represent the region in the state Talent Contest.

## State Event Format

Sixteen talent acts will compete in the State Contest. This will include the 12 regional winning talent acts plus four talent acts to be selected at large.

Students wishing to compete for one of the at large slots in the State Talent Contest will submit a video by April 15. Additional information on video submission will be provided by the Executive Secretary by April 1. A panel of judges will select the four at large acts and acts will be notified by May 1.

All sixteen acts will perform before a panel of judges at the State FFA Convention. The judges will select the top eight acts. These will be announced/posted by 5:00 p.m.

The eight acts selected by the judges will perform following the Tuesday evening session. Students in attendance will vote to select the top four acts.

The top four acts will return and perform one additional number. A panel of judges will then select 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> place.

## EQUIPMENT

Equipment provided by student:

- Instruments, music, and other equipment will be provided by the competitors.

Equipment provided at the event site:

- Microphone
- Sound system with ability to play tracks if pre-submitted

## Scoring

Judges will confer to determine the top eight acts during round one.

Students in attendance at Kentucky FFAs Got Talent will vote to select the top four acts.

A panel of judges will confer to determine 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> place competitors.
