





Highlighting the #TEACHAG CAMPAIGN

#TeachAg Kentucky currently supports **118 students** across the state as they actively pursue agricultural education career paths in high school and beyond.

BIG WINS FROM 2025:



Hired **Cassidy Hutchison** to manage Teach Ag Kentucky because we are so passionate about recruiting and retaining the next generation of Kentucky teachers.

Student Teacher Summit: Attended by 25 students who were either currently student teaching or would be student teaching the next semester. They learned what to expect as a student teacher and how to thrive in their own classrooms.

Ad Ed Invitational: For high schoolers who indicated interest in pursuing an agricultural education degree. Workshops show them what to expect in college and what it's like to be an ag teacher. Two more are scheduled for 2026.

Teach Ag Signing: During the 2025 State FFA Convention, 29 high school seniors planning to major in agricultural education signed with representatives from the university they planned to attend.

Teach Ag Outreach at FFA Camp and the State Fair:

Cassidy and Teach Ag Kentucky Ambassadors set up a booth during each week of FFA Camp and at the State Fair, and discussed majoring in agricultural education – what classes might be like, where they could go to college, etc. Students could also sign up for the Teach Ag Kentucky campaign.

Teach Ag Kentucky Ambassadors: Four students currently majoring in agricultural education were selected through an application and interview process to act as representatives for the Teach Ag Kentucky campaign and share their first-person accounts of what it's like to major in agricultural education.



Annual Gift Supports Financial Literacy Education and Grants for Student-Led Agricultural Enterprises

FIRST SOUTHERN NATIONAL BANK PLEDGES \$100,000 ANNUALLY TO SUPPORT KENTUCKY FFA MEMBERS

A \$100,000 commitment from First Southern National Bank has equipped Kentucky FFA members with financial literacy skills and funding to launch or grow their own agriculture-based businesses.

There will be two levels of grants – SAE Launch Grants, for which students can apply with a business plan, a budget and projections, or SAE Mini-Grants, for students who complete First Southern's Give, Save, Spend financial literacy curriculum.

In addition, First Southern's support will also provide financial literacy education for Kentucky agriculture teachers. Students rely on the guidance of their agriculture teachers as they launch their SAE projects, so strong financial knowledge will help teachers advise students in making smart, sustainable business decisions.

“At First Southern National Bank, we're committed to investing in individuals and communities who are shaping a brighter future,” said Arnie Akers, regional president at First Southern National Bank. “By supporting those who champion education, leadership, and financial literacy, we empower the next generation to make thoughtful decisions—laying the foundation for lives that flourish in every aspect.”

The Kentucky FFA Foundation is pleased to announce that Farm Credit Mid-America has significantly increased its support for Kentucky FFA members. Through this expanded contribution, Farm Credit Mid-America has made a substantial impact on several opportunities for Kentucky FFA members.

State FFA Degrees: Each year more than 500 Kentucky students receive their state FFA degree. Farm Credit Mid-America's support provides each one with the golden State Degree charm and a frame they can use to showcase their achievement.

State Star Farmer Awards: Twelve Regional Star Farmer candidates compete annually for the title of Kentucky State Star Farmer. Support for State FFA Officer Travel: In 2023, Farm Credit Mid-America began supporting the travel of Kentucky FFA State Officers. During a single year, state officers will personally connect with more than 13,000 students, visiting chapters, conducting leadership workshops, and keynoting meetings and banquets.

Shark Tank Contest: The Kentucky FFA Foundation has offered grants up to \$5,000 for a handful of young ag entrepreneurs each year. Students develop a pitch video, comprehensive business plan and pitch to our "sharks" on stage at State FFA Convention. This year, Farm Credit Mid-America was the sole sponsor of this incredible program. ♦

2025 Ag Tag Donations Near Record- Breaking \$1M Milestone

PAVING THE WAY FOR THE NEXT GENERATION

Commissioner Jonathan Shell has announced that Kentucky farmers donated nearly a million dollars for the Ag Tag Program in 2025. The total, \$995,440.74, is the largest amount ever donated in a single year, topping last year's total by more than \$60,000.

“For the last three years the Ag Tag Program has seen new record-breaking amounts every year,” Commissioner Shell said. “This couldn’t be possible without the wonderful support from our Kentucky farmers. They see value in supporting the next generation of farmers through their donations to the Ag Tag fund. It’s that generosity that will help ensure Kentucky agriculture has a bright future.”

Kentucky motorists who buy or renew farm vehicle license plates, or “ag tags,” may make a voluntary donation of up to \$10 to the Ag Tag Fund. These donations are divided equally among Kentucky 4-H, Kentucky FFA and youth programs of the Kentucky Department of Agriculture (KDA). **This year, each group will receive \$331,813.58. Since 2016, Kentucky FFA and Kentucky 4-H have received, collectively, more than \$4 million.**

Half of the 4-H and FFA donations are returned to local councils and chapters. FFA chapters are free to use the money to meet the greatest needs in their community, such as FFA jackets for students in need or helping cover travel costs to leadership events.

The Kentucky FFA Foundation uses the remainder of their funds to support the annual Kentucky FFA State Convention and Ag Achiever Grants that allow local FFA chapters to grow educational opportunities locally. These funds also support all Kentucky students who compete at National FFA Convention, the Kentucky FFA display at the state fair, and much more. ♦

Explore Your Giving Options

If you are interested in making a gift to the Kentucky FFA Foundation, you have many options for making an impact that best fits your unique situation.

GIFTS OF CASH

The majority of gifts to the Kentucky FFA Foundation are in the form of cash. If you itemize your tax deductions, you may claim as a charitable deduction a cash gift of up to 50 percent of your adjusted gross income.

GIFTS OF SECURITIES

Gifts of appreciated securities can provide special tax advantages: you may completely avoid capital gains taxes; and the fair market value of the stock may be claimed as a charitable deduction on your income tax, up to 30 percent of adjusted gross income for those who itemize, with a five-year carryover.

The simplest way to make a gift of stock is to instruct your broker or banker to transfer it to the Kentucky FFA Foundation. The broker should then contact the Kentucky FFA Foundation for further instructions.

GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE

Gifts of homes, farms, and other real property can receive the same tax treatment as gifts of securities: no capital gains tax plus deductibility at fair market value. If this is appealing to you, please make plans to discuss intent and restrictions with the Kentucky FFA Foundation.

GIFTS OF LIFE INSURANCE

When you name the Kentucky FFA Foundation as the owner and sole beneficiary of a life insurance policy, you receive an immediate income tax charitable deduction for the lesser of the policy's fair market value or the net premiums paid. Premiums you pay later are also tax deductible.

MEMORIAL & HONOR GIFTS

You may designate gifts to remember or honor a relative or friend for a specific purpose, or you may allow the Foundation to use such gifts for general support. Acknowledgment will be made to the family of the deceased if the name and address of the closest survivor is provided.

MATCHING GIFTS

Some are able to increase their gift to the Kentucky FFA Foundation by employer matching. If your employer has such a program, your gift may be multiplied once, twice, or even three times. Usually, your employer's personnel department can provide information about a matching gift program and forms to send with contributions.

ESTATE & PLANNED GIFTS

Although outright gifts provide valuable support for current programs, estate giving provides substantial support for future programs. This form of giving is particularly suitable if you desire to make a larger gift through your estate rather than in your lifetime. The allowable estate tax deduction for charitable gifts remain unlimited under the new tax laws.

WILLS

The most common form of an estate gift to the Kentucky FFA Foundation is a specific bequest in a will. You should arrange to draft your will with your attorney. Foundation staff are available upon request to confer with you and your attorney in drafting the appropriate bequest clauses.

GIFTS IN TRUST

If you wish to receive income during your life and at the same time provide a significant gift to the Kentucky FFA Foundation, you should consider establishing a charitable remainder trust, that is, a life income trust.

GIFTS-IN-KIND

Another way to support the Foundation is through gifts of tangible personal property.

FOREVER BLUE DONORS

The Forever Blue program honors donors who have generously committed \$10,000 or more to the Kentucky FFA Foundation. These dedicated supporters have the opportunity to endow specific Kentucky FFA programs and events or direct their gifts to benefit a local FFA chapter, ensuring lasting impact where it matters most.

Through the Forever Blue Endowment, donors can create a meaningful legacy that strengthens agricultural education, supports future leaders, and pays tribute to the experiences that shaped their own FFA journey. Their generosity ensures that Kentucky FFA will continue to thrive for generations to come.
